Interpretation of Diploma Supplement and Transcript Information for Taught Modular Programmes

From 1 September 2020 the University introduced a new 'compensation' assessment model (Scheme A) for most students commencing programmes from this date. Students who commenced their programme before September 2020 normally remain on the existing 'condonement' assessment model (Scheme B). The scheme that applies to the student is indicated overleaf.

The University's degrees are awarded by York St John University. The language of instruction for all awards is English. Awards typically qualify students for study at the next H.E. level. Programmes of study are organised according to a modular structure. Each module is a self-contained unit of teaching, learning and assessment which is assigned a credit value according to the number of notional study hours assigned to it. One credit point is assigned for 10 notional study hours. Modules are assigned a level which maps to the Framework of Higher Education Qualifications in England, Wales and Northern Ireland as follows:

Modules are specified for a programme of study at validation. Information about programme structure can be found in the relevant programme specification on the University website. Students typically study 120 credits in one year as a full-time undergraduate student or 180 credits in a year as a full-time postgraduate student. A part-time student will study the same number of credits for an award at a slower rate. Credit may be transferred to the University from another UK or international HEI. On selected exchange programmes marks on the University scale are assigned according to agreed mark translation tables and incorporated into award calculations. For information on the performance at another HEI, that institution's transcript should be consulted.

All modules are marked according to a standardised 0 - 100 marking scale. A student who resits an assessment for a module is normally only eligible for the pass mark for the module as designated in the Undergraduate or taught Postgraduate marking scale; with the exception of qualified fails where the original mark for the module is awarded on successful completion of the deficient work.
