GRADE II

Applies principles, concepts and skills to problem situations and analyses, synthesizes and evaluates issues in a competent manner. Organises information meaningfully and communicates ideas in an effective manner.

GRADE III

Shows a good grasp of the principles, concepts and skills contained in the syllabus. Applies principles, concepts and skills to problem situations and analyses, synthesizes and evaluates issues in a competent manner. Organises information meaningfully and communicates ideas in an effective manner.

GRADE IV

Shows a satisfactory grasp of the principles, concepts and skills contained in the syllabus. Applies principles, concepts and skills to problem situations and analyses, synthesizes and evaluates issues in a competent manner. Organises information meaningfully and communicates ideas in an effective manner.

GRADE V

Shows an acceptable grasp of the principles, concepts and skills contained in the syllabus. Applies principles, concepts and skills to problem situations and analyses, synthesizes and evaluates issues in a competent manner. Organises information meaningfully and communicates ideas in an effective manner.

GRADE VI

Shows a limited grasp of the principles, concepts and skills contained in the syllabus. Shows basic weaknesses in the application of principles, concepts and skills to problem situations and in analysing or evaluating issues. Shows basic weaknesses in organising and communicating information.

GRADE VII

Shows a very limited grasp of the principles, concepts and skills contained in the syllabus. Shows little or no competence in the application of principles, concepts and skills and in analysing or evaluating issues. Shows poor skills in organising and communicating information.
